
# Give Kids a SMILE

## Making connections

Bridge to Benefits is a multi-state project by Children's Defense Fund to improve the well-being of families and individuals by linking them to public work support programs and tax credits. Parents or guardians should be encouraged to go to mn.bridgetobenefits.org to find an eligibility screening tool. They will be asked a few simple, non-identifying questions. The Minnesota Dental Association is proud to coordinate a statewide charitable program that unites the generosity of thousands of volunteers in delivering free dental care to children in need. This program, "Give Kids a Smile," also happens at a national level and, in lots of different ways, in states and dental societies across the country.

#### Your one-stop GKAS planning guide

Whether you are a veteran of Give Kids a Smile planning or a novice, the MDA encourages you to take advantage of a valuable resource, the **Participation Kit.** 

The Participation Kit is a compilation of essential documents, references and tips offered by a variety of experienced volunteers. We guarantee you'll save yourself some time and frustration if you take about a half hour to thoroughly review the Kit. It's divided into several parts. Here are some highlights:

**Event preparation checklist** - A new addition to the Kit, this gives a month-by-month listing of essential planning steps.

**Sample letters -** Download and personalize an appointment reminder (in English and Spanish), as well as a letter and press release for your community.

**Training -** Get your staff ready for a day full of little patients by together

reviewing training on infant oral exam techniques.

**Promotional fliers** - Download, print and distribute fliers (in multiple languages) in your community to let families know about the availability of free care for children in need.

**Scheduling ideas -** GKAS is like no other day of the year. Some strategic scheduling can make a big difference in your event's success.

**Forms -** Tailored by MDA legal counsel for this program, consent-to-treatment forms are available in many languages, together with health history forms and a take-home letter for your patients.

The Participation Kit is available on the MDA website. When you register to host a Give Kids a Smile event, you will receive an e-mail with a link to the Kit. You can also find it, along with many other resources, on the Give Kids a Smile page in the dental professional's section of the website.

Resources for Ongoing Care is a listing of Minnesota dental clinics that offer services at a reduced cost or sliding-scale fee or provide services to patients who are on public care programs. The list is broken into geographic areas of Minnesota and is easy to find at mndental.org. Please make print-outs of the appropriate list for your patients.

Smiles Change Lives provides orthodontic care in private orthodontic offices in many areas throughout Minnesota. This program serves children ages 11 to 18 who have a significant malocclusion, can be treated in one stage, have good oral hygiene and cannot afford orthodontic treatment. Applicants need to be below

200% of the federal poverty level. If accepted into the program, the orthodontic treatment will be provided at a greatly reduced fee. To help a patient apply for this program, call 888-900-3554 or visit smileschangelives.org.

United Way 2-1-1 partners with Give Kids a Smile each year by serving as a central phone bank to refer patients to a local participating clinic. But every day of the year, this service is available to help families access medical care, prescription drugs, housing, food and other essential needs. Multilingual access is available for more than 100 languages. Please find the United Way 2-1-1 flier in the Give Kids a Smile online Participation Kit, then print it out and share it with families.
